

BDMUN 2025: Dress Code

At BDMUN, maintaining professionalism is a key expectation throughout the conference. Delegates are required to follow a dress code during all committee sessions and events. The dress code for each day is as follows:

Day 1: Western Business Formals

Day 2: Traditional Indian Attire (Western Formals will be permitted too)

Day 3: Western Business Formals

The guidelines for Western Business Formals are as follows:

A formal jacket or suit with dress pants (no jeans or cargo pants), along with a dress shirt (tie optional). Sandals, slippers, hats, or caps are not permitted.

- A dress, suit, or dress slacks (no jeans) or skirt of appropriate length paired with a formal top. Sandals, slippers, hats, or caps are not permitted.

We encourage all delegates to exercise their own judgment for what may be deemed acceptable when following the dress code. If a delegate's attire is considered unsuitable, they may be asked to change into more appropriate clothing. Additionally, we ask that your attire respects the diverse cultural backgrounds of our participants and reflects the professional nature of the event.
